



The Transplantation Society's Council bestows Honours and Awards to recognize individuals contributing to the field of transplantation through outstanding achievement (for basic scientists, clinicians and in developing countries), mentorship and training, as well as humanitarian efforts.

#### FOR OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN TRANSPLANTATION (BASIC SCIENCE)

The Award for Outstanding Achievement in Transplantation (Basic Science) will be presented to a basic scientist who has made outstanding contributions to transplantation science.

#### AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN TRANSPLANTATION (CLINICAL)

The Award for Outstanding Achievement in Transplantation (Clinical) will be presented to a clinician who has made outstanding contributions to transplantation.

#### AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN TRANSPLANTATION (DEVELOPING COUNTRY)

The Award for Outstanding Achievement in Transplantation (Developing Country) will be presented to an individual who has made outstanding contributions to transplantation in a developing country.

#### AWARD FOR MENTORSHIP OR EDUCATION AND TRAINING IN TRANSPLANTATION

The Award for Mentorship or Education and Training in Transplantation will be presented to recognize the outstanding contributions of an individual in mentoring or to education and training in the field of transplantation.

#### HUMANITARIAN AWARD IN TRANSPLANTATION

The Humanitarian Award in Transplantation will be presented to recognize the outstanding humanitarian contributions of an individual in the field of transplantation.



The Women in Transplantation Steering Committee bestows awards to recognize women who have advanced the field of transplantation through leadership, mentorship, science or other outstanding contributions.

#### WOMAN LEADER IN TRANSPLANTATION AWARD

The Woman Leader in Transplantation Award will be presented to one woman who has helped further the field of transplantation through research, policies, leadership, initiatives or other regarded contributions.

#### UNSUNG HERO AWARD

The Unsung Hero Award will be presented to one woman who has had an extraordinary impact in the field of transplantation through community service, volunteering, mentorship or other community based activity.

The Young Investigator Awards are given to recipients who have submitted abstracts to the International Congress of The Transplantation Society and received the highest scores from an international panel of reviewers.

#### YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARDS

- Thirty (30) awards for Young Investigators will be given to assist with travel and registration costs for the eligible recipients.
- These will be awarded to the top 30 scored abstracts whose first author applies for the award and who is under the age of 35 years old.
- Acknowledgement in the on-site program pocket guide.
- Funds collected from sponsorship will go 100% towards bringing young investigators to the meeting.



#### "STARTING OFF IN TRANSPLANTATION" TRAVEL AWARDS (unlimited)

- These awards will be given to individuals who are from a low-resource setting and who are planning to start a transplant program in their region.
- These awards are only open to participants from emerging nations.





The mission of The Transplantation Society is to provide global leadership in the practice of human transplantation.

The responsibility of The Transplantation Society is to establish guidelines of clinical practice, advance programs of education, and to promote ethical standards for clinical care and scientific investigation.

The Spanish Society of Transplantation (Sociedad Española de Trasplante - SET) is a scientific society with national scope within Spain's territories. Its aims are exclusively scientific and are towards the development and progress of organ transplantation in Spain.

The SET promotes the spreading of knowledge in the field of organ transplantation via a biennial national congress, scientific meetings (conferences, symposia), call for grants and internship opportunities for its members to further their education.

The Spanish Society of Transplantation is working closely with other national and international scientific societies with similar aims, and collaborates with the National Transplant Organization (ONT) in projects of common interest.

SET also provides advisory services to people and institutions regarding organ transplantation.

The Madrid Transplantation Society (Sociedad Madrileña de Trasplantes - MTS) and the Foundation of MTS were established in 2006. The Society includes surgeons, transplant physicians, immunologists, specialists in infectious diseases and transplant coordinators working in the Community of Madrid.

Notably, Madrid is the only city that performs all solid organ transplants including bowel and mutivisceral transplantation in adults and pediatric patients. The Foundational Council was composed by Dr. Jose M. Morales, President, Dr. Valentin Cuervas-Mons and Dr. Andres Varela, Vice-Presidents. The MTS together with other regional societies, Catalan and Andalucia, founded the Spanish Society of Transplantation (SET) in 2009, while maintaining very close collaboration.

The MTS organized six Congresses (biannually), two of them included a Joint Meeting with the American Society of Transplantation. Concerning investigation, the MTS have supported pioneer clinical investigations such as transplantation with expanded criteria donors (renal, liver and lung), and donation after circulatory death with controlled and uncontrolled DCD, normothermic perfusion of donor lungs for preservation and assessment with the Organ Care System Lung before bilateral transplantation, among others. Other important activities have been educational initiatives, such as Courses with Primary Care Physicians, Courses of Renal Transplantation in Latin America and support of transplants activities in Madrid. In these years, the MTS have been composed by 120 members. The MTS in 2012 took the initiative together with SET (Spanish Society of Transplantation) to present the candidacy of Madrid to be the host city for the 2018 TTS Congress. In June 2014, Madrid was officially declared the winner in competing with Buenos Aires and Montreal.

Since November 2015, the current council is composed by Dr. Amado Andres, President; and Dr. Carlos Jimenez and Ana Sanchez-Frucutoso, Vice-presidents.

Both the SET and MTS are working hard (in collaboration with Madrid Convention Bureau and IFEMA) to organize an amazing scientific Congress in August 2018.

## About the Venue Destination Madrid and IFEMA



Madrid is the capital of Spain since the year 1562 and is located right in the heart of the Iberian Peninsula. It is situated in the center of the Castilian plain at 646 meters above sea level. Madrid occupies third position in the list of largest cities of Europe. Madrid and its suburbs are located on the banks of the River Manzanares that flows through the centre of the country and the Madrid community. In Spain, a community is comprised of the main city and the immediate suburbs and villages.

While Madrid possesses modern infrastructure, it has preserved the look and feel of many of its historic neighbourhoods and streets. Its landmarks include the Royal Palace of Madrid; the Royal Theatre with its restored 1850 Opera House; the Buen Retiro Park, founded in 1631; the 19<sup>th</sup>-Century National Library building (founded in 1712) containing some of Spain's historical archives; a large number of national museums, and the Golden Triangle of Art, located along the Paseo del Prado and comprising several art museums: Prado Museum, the Reina Sofía Museum, a museum of modern art, and the Thyssen-Bornemisza Museum, which completes the shortcomings of the other two museums. Cibeles Palace and Fountain have become one of the monument symbols of the city.


